

What is Auxiliary Communications (AUXCOMM)? "Auxiliary Communications, or 'AUXCOMM', refers to organizations and personnel which provide various types of emergency communications support to emergency management, public safety, and other government agencies. AUXCOMM services are typically voluntary, and are commonly provided by amateur radio communicators, but may also include other volunteer organizations which have established relationships with the government organizations they support."



DEFINED POSITION IN THE INCIDENT COMMAND STRUCTURE (ICS)






PART OF THE COMMUNICATIONS UNIT (COMU) CREDENTIALS PROFICIENCY EXPERIENCE



AUXCOMM – part of the Communications Unit (COMU)






AUXCOMM is Organization Neutral Auxiliary Communicators
